The articles must be original and should not have been published previously, and the manuscript will be doubleblind peer-reviewed. Authors are invited to submit papers through the submission system. Once your article is accepted, you will receive an email from the submission system. ### Publishing ethics

This journal operates a double-blind review process. All contributions will be initially assessed by the editor for suitability for the journal. Papers deemed suitable are then typically a minimum of sent to two independent expert reviewers to assess the scientific quality of the paper. The Editor is responsible for the final decision regarding acceptance or rejection of articles. The Editor's decision is final. The peer review process is following: Author submits paper to journal  $\rightarrow$ Editor's initial evaluation of paper (go to next step if it meets the requirements of journal, otherwise reject and inform author)→ Invite experts for peer review→ Experts send comments to editor→ Editor decides to accept (or reject and inform authors)  $\rightarrow$  Editor asks author to revise  $\rightarrow$  Author revises and submits revised paper→ Editor original and/or reviewers reevaluate to decide further revisions needed or reject or accept  $\rightarrow$ Inform author

## Proofs

One set of page proofs (as PDF files) will be sent by e-mail to the corresponding author or a link will be provided in the e-mail so that authors can download the files themselves. Please list your corrections quoting line number. If, for any reason, this is not possible, then mark the corrections and any other comments (including replies to the Query Form) on a printout of your proof and return by fax, or scan the pages and e-mail. Please use this proof only for checking the typesetting, editing, completeness and correctness of the text, tables and figures. Significant changes to the article as accepted for publication will only be considered at this stage with permission from the Editor. It is important to ensure that all corrections are sent back to us in one communication: please check carefully before replying, as inclusion of any subsequent corrections cannot be guaranteed.

## Offprints

The corresponding author, at no cost, will be provided with a PDF file of the article via e-mail (the PDF file is a watermarked version of the published article and includes a cover sheet with the journal cover image and a disclaimer outlining the terms and conditions of use).
